Title One update: We are in budget season- Mrs. Keffer, Ms. Razgha, and Mrs.Waldrop will meet to plan for the 2018-2019 Title I budget. We just wrapped up Jump Rope for Heart, fifth graders will be going to the Jacksonville Zoo to end their field study, and our Sweetheart Social was a success. Second grade play was fantastic and Kindergarten has begun practicing for their play. We are not on the announced visit list for accreditation but we could be on the unannounced visit list. Mrs. Waldrop sent this information out to staff today. The accreditation narrative may be printed and distributed to staff.

AVID update: We worked with the leadership team to put the evidences in the OneNote, continuing to put AVID updates in the PawPrints and What's Up Wildcats sent by Mrs. Waldrop, and each grade level is responsible for an AVID spotlight on the news. We are using AVID strategies during PD and will use WICOR for the Muffin's for Moms breakfast.

Principal comments and Safety: The last few weeks have been a reflective time after the Parkland tragedy. Safety procedures have been reevaluated. Mrs. Waldrop asked us to discuss, "What would make you or your child feel safer on campus?" Suggestions that were made will be taken to Mr. Forson: the fences near the apartments and the road are too close and are also too exposed to the outside of the campus, we want to build the automatic response to a lockdown drill, the need for substitutes to be trained for the drills and possibly making the drills uniform throughout the district, front entrance doors and Osceola Hall being glass entry is concerning, having police presence on the campus every day, training for emergency situations for all the teachers, and practicing the drills. We will review this again at our next meeting.

Comments: Sarah Blevins has reached out to the principal at Murray MS to come to our future meetings to discuss the expectations for our fifth graders heading to Murray. The lottery opened up for camps in the county for a discount for kids who are on free and reduced lunch-Mrs. Lawshe suggested using the letter found on our school website where Osceola is listed as 100% free and reduced.
