- Promotes family involvement and student accountability.
- Students will use binders and planners to stay organized parents should check them daily.

Parent Pick-Up (PPU) Procedures


- 2:30 PM Gate opens for Pre–K pick–up only
 - Green Tag required
 - No older siblings allowed at this time
- 2:45 PM Pick-up begins for all remaining students (Pre-K to 5th grade)
- Please be patient when using Parent Pick-Up, especially during the first few weeks of school.

A helpful tip:

Encourage your child to practice buckling and unbuckling their seatbelt independently to help speed up the process.

Important Dismissal Reminders

- **Critical Reminders** With increased traffic and safety updates, it is important that we work together to ensure the safety of our students.
- •We ask that parents/families remain in their vehicles at **ALL TIMES** during dismissal. Please have your *car tag displayed*
- •Anyone picking up your child must be listed on the student information form. Those without a tag will be asked to park and show ID in the office

- •Early Release Wednesday All students are dismissed at 1:45 on Wednesday .




Stay Connected with OES



- Reteach Opportunities: If a student struggles with a concept, teachers will provide reteach sessions to support mastery.





Home Access Center (HAC)

Label jackets, water bottles and lunch boxes. The lost and found will be located in the cafeteria. After each marking period we donate unclaimed items.








Reminders
